Context Statement

Ceduna Area School caters for students from R-12. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2024 is 444. Ceduna Area School is classified as Category 2 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 42% Aboriginal students, 13% students with disabilities, 32% students with English as an additional language or dialect (EALD) funded background, 5% children/young people in care. Governing Council Report

Governing Council was made up of a group of committed parents in 2024 who undertook the role of Governance at Ceduna Area School for the year. They carried out their role of approving policies and procedure changes as presented to them at each meeting.

The schools' strategic directions were discussed at each meeting and procedures of achieving the goals outlined. The role of the Finance Committee continued to be undertaken in the Governing Council Meetings in 2024 to save the necessity of an additional meeting.

This worked well and allowed all members to be aware of all aspects of the finance areas.

Policy updates and changes discussed during the year included Safe Arrival of Children procedure, Sun Protection, Volunteer Protocols and Bus Risk Assessment.

We took delivery of a new white bus, and some new filtered water bottle fillers have been installed in East Wing, West Wing, North Wing and the Art Alcove.

The Special Ed Hub is under construction, and it is exciting to see the progress being made on this building. Expected date of occupancy is the beginning of Term 2 2025.

Local delivery of specialist subjects in 2024 allowed more of our students to study subjects their preferred subjects online with other students from surrounding schools. We had several students select this option and they all reported it as highly successful, and their outcomes reflected this.

The school continued to have issues with finding relief drivers for buses and had to combine some runs during the year due to not being able to find drivers for the buses. Governing Council is aware of this issue and has raised it with the Department.


The school organized an Open Day in Term 1 which was highly successful and allowed Parents and Community members to attend the site and see all the facilities and equipment. The Lumination Lab and STEM rooms were open to check out as well as all the other classrooms and facilities. Ice creams and Barra Wraps were a highlight.

Governing Council is a great way of finding out what goes on at School and having an opportunity to be aware of future events and even offer guidance on what they might look like. All Parents and Caregivers should consider becoming part of this group if their circumstances and interests allow them to do so.


Performance Summary NAPLAN Proficiency





Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
