Context Statement

Augusta Park Primary School caters for students from R-6. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2024 is 189. Augusta Park Primary School is classified as Category 1 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 59% Aboriginal students, 17% students with disabilities, 39% students with English as an additional language or dialect (EALD) funded background, 6% children/young people in care. The contributions of the Clontarf Academy boys towards our Sports Day over the last few years have been invaluable and greatly appreciated. On Family night this year Governing Council elected to support the local Lions club and they were able to provide a BBQ and drinks stall for the night raising a considerable amount of money to assist the community. As always, the Christmas raffle was well received and provided some additional fundraising for the 2024 year. 2024 also saw both a Mother's and Father's Day stall organised by Tash Sghrippa and the SRC. This was extremely successful with numerous students and parents commenting on the event which will be continued each year for both celebrations.




Performance Summary NAPLAN Proficiency



Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
