
Context Statement

Adelaide East Education Centre caters for students from 7-12. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2023 is 61. Adelaide East Education Centre is classified as Category 6 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 3% Aboriginal students, 100% students with disabilities, 2% children/young people in care. Performance Summary NAPLAN Proficiency

In 2023, the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA) - a Commonwealth Independent statutory authority - announced changes to NAPLAN performance reporting. This new way of reporting by ACARA that NAPLAN results from 2023 will not be comparable to previous years. The new approach replaces the previous numerical NAPLAN bands and the national minimum standard.





Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.

2023 Governing Council Report

It was my pleasure to take on the role of Governing Council Chair for the first time in 2023. A mix of new and experienced members met regularly throughout the year via Microsoft Teams.

The year began with the school welcoming 7 new students with a number of new students joining the community throughout the year and concluded with 16 students graduating with Modified SACE. A number of new staff were also welcomed and we bid farewell to others.

In 2023 Governing Council has focused on decision making regarding the running of the school. Perhaps the most noticeable decision being a move from using the QKR App for school payments to now using EFTPOS facilities. This has resulted in more efficient processes for receipt of payments, students gaining skills and a sense of independence in being able to pay for cafe and excursions using their card, plus a saving on the overall cost to the school.

Fundraising this year was coordinated by staff - including a number of Schnitzel Nights at the Paradise Hotel, plus the sale of confectionery as ordered by students throughout the year. The largest of these fundraisers was the Paint & Sip Night, organised by Shellee, where well over \$600 was raised. All fundraising was to be put towards students attending the Operation Flinders Camp in October 2023. Unfortunately, this camp was postponed so funds have been held over to support students attending in 2024.

A special thanks must go to Sasi and all the staff at Adelaide East Education Centre who worked hard to support the students, not only with their learning, but with other challenges faced throughout the year, including the forced four-day closure due to a COVID outbreak in October.

Finally, I would like to thank the other members of the Governing Council for 2023, Michele, Nicki, Chelsea and Josh. A very big thank you must go to Brenton Altschwager who over the past years has taken responsibility for a number of roles on Governing Council, including Chairperson and Treasurer. Brenton, your contribution has been greatly appreciated.
