Context Statement

Felixstow Primary School caters for students from R-6. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2024 is 81. Felixstow Primary School is classified as Category 5 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 5% Aboriginal students, 20% students with disabilities, 5% students with English as an additional language or dialect (EALD) funded background, 2% children/young people in care. Governing Council Report

The Felixstow Primary School Governing Council had another successful year in 2024, *Rebuilding Community and Connections* was a primary focus for the council.

Key areas:

Fundraising, particularly for OSHC to remain viable. Thankfully, after much fundraising and increased numbers in attendance things are looking positive for the service. This will need to continue but it has boosted our spirits to see things moving in the right direction.


Uniforms, towards the end of last year the council had discussions around the benefits of making our uniform compulsory. Key reasons behind this were to increase visibility within the community as well as to foster a sense of community and belonging among our students. This idea was received positively by the families at the school and the new school uniform policy is in the process of being implemented as of first term 2025.

Traffic safety, The hard work of previous Governing Councils and staff finally bore fruit in the latter half of 2024 with the much needed verge upgrades in front of the school, promoting safe crossing of students and reduced speed of drivers. Over the summer break school zone signage was put up along Briar Road, hopefully this will make some difference to the traffic situation around our school.


Performance Summary





Exceeding Strong Developing Needs Additional Support Absent/Withdrawn Exempt





Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
