Context Statement

Governing Council

In 2023 Governing Council agreed to budget for an outdoor and indoor upgrade. Through our work on wellbeing we recognised Educators' efforts to declutter and redecorate the play-spaces. The work should be completed in early 2024. This will include screening between the neighbour's yard and our mud-kitchen play space, covering the chain link fence so that children can no longer see into the yard. This area was screened with mesh/shade cloth, however, it hasn't worn well in the elements. We are hoping for bamboo screening panels, giving the play space a natural look. Educators introduced a new communication app uploading photos and curriculum content to Class Dojo. Families found the app easy to navigate. Class Dojo has been an efficient way to share with and receive information from families. Our Governing Council chose to focus on one Fundraising event. Our Climb-a-thon was well attended by families and extended families supporting raising money to purchase gross motor equipment and new balls (basketball, football, tennis). Educators shared photos of equipment purchased and children enjoying using the balls in play. We have endorsed 3 updated Policies and Procedures: Local healthy food supply and nutrition policy, Sun protection policy, Local water safety procedure.


Attendance Comment

In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.

Quality of Teaching and Learning


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)
