#### **Context Statement**

Information about Settlers Farm Campus Kindergarten is available on the centres website, as well as the Australian Childrens Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) website.

Settlers Farm is an established community, situated 19 kilometres, north of Adelaide at Paralowie. There is a shopping/community centre close to the kindergarten. There is a broad representation of various cultural backgrounds (identifying as Aboriginal/ Torres Strait Islander and children with English as an Additional language/dialect (EALD). Approximately 90% of kindergarten children attend the Settlers Farm Campus on exit. Parent volunteers are active in decision making through the Governing Council. In 2023, Settlers Farm Campus Kindergarten is assigned by the Department for Education as a `Category 1' site with a Preschool Director Band A-2. The kindergarten has a cap of 70 eligible enrolments attending 15 hours per week, and one playgroup operating weekly. Staffing includes 1.0 Director, 1.4 Teachers, 1.5 Early Childhood Workers (Teacher assistants), Universal Access staffing, Preschool support workers, and Bilingual Assistants. Children attend 2 consecutive days (with an alternate Wednesday morning) to provide more consistency for their learning with learning. Children participate in various cultural celebrations including Chinese New Year, Shrove Tuesday, Harmony Day, Khmer New Year, Easter, Anzac Day, Reconciliation week, Diwali, Halloween, Naidoc week, Mother's Day, Father's Day, celebrating children and staff birthdays, Remembrance Day and Christmas. Throughout the year children participated in a variety of special events and experiences including incursions with 'Mobile junk and nature playground', Kindergarten photos, attending co-located campus assemblies visits to the reception classes and events, caring for the vegetable garden, Discothon, National Simultaneous story time, transition visits to Settlers Farm Campus, Recycling Show, art show, Summer Celebration, Magician show, and the End of Year celebration. Throughout each day, children are taught in an open-spaced kindergarten room with all educators. Small group time is implemented once per day (literacy - oral language, phonological awareness, and child protection curriculum) as well as two large group times- in the morning to greet educators, acknowledge our country, discuss curriculum focus areas and one at the end of the day for relaxation, discussions, stories and songs and say goodbye.

In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.


#### Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

#### Support of Learning


#### Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)


#### Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)
