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Context Statement

Information about Chandlers Hill Kindergarten is available on the centres website, as well as the Australian Children's Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) website.

This year we had 66 children - 2 groups of 33 children. With this cohort, we had one Director, 2 teachers and 2 part-time ECW's as well as a pre-school support worker (for some of the time) for children requiring additional support.

Governing Council Report

On behalf of Chandlers Hill Kindergarten Governing Council, it is with pleasure that I present the 2024 Governing Council Chair report.

The governing council consists of a handful of dedicated parents and the Kindy director, meeting during the terms to discuss the functionality and objectives of the Kindergarten. Each agenda consisting of building and equipment maintenance, financial updates, summary of curriculum from the previous and upcoming terms and the planning of upcoming events. Through the year, student enrolment numbers at the Kindy have been at full capacity, including the mid-year students.

The children have had a fun and busy year with a range of activities and experiences to develop their school readiness. The year started with the previous mid-year students having already completed two terms and being able to help the new students settle in and learn the new routines.

During the remaining year the children had a range of experiences including learning about the lifecycles of monarch butterflies and chickens, visits to the Adelaide Zoo and the local aged care facility to sing to the residents, visits from Animal Anonymous, the Council to learn about recycling, a police officer to learn about road safety and the local librarians, fun dress ups and involvement in the Happy Valley Primary School parade for book week and being part of the school's sports day. A highlight for families was being able to be part of the obstacle course at Kindy and see their children enjoying themselves outside with their peers.

The mid-year students had a wonderful graduation ceremony in the middle of the year as they were farewelled to start school, and we welcomed the new children in term 4.

The Kindy has been amazing at developing the children's skills for their journey into school in an enjoyable way through the "You can Do it" program, focussing on personal and social capability. The children are prepared to take this next step into school having learnt sounds, rhyming words, syllables, numeracy and even able to write their names!

From a maintenance perspective, a decking was installed during the year which has been popular with the children for outside reading, play and dance parties! Garden beds were also installed with children learning about environmental sustainability and exposing them to range of vegetables to smell and taste.

Thank you to all the wonderful people that volunteered their time to visit, educate and support our children's development. A special thankyou to the governing council for their time and contributions through the year. An even bigger thankyou to the director and all the staff, it would not be the incredible Kindy it is without you!


Attendance Comment

In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.

In 2024 there was quite a few illnesses which kept children home. We also had many families taking holidays during the colder months, which contributed with our lower attendance rate during the Winter.


Preschool Family Opinion Survey

Governance, Leadership and Management






Safety, Health and Wellbeing
