Governing Council Report

It is with great pride and gratitude that I present the 2024 Governing Council Chair Report, reflecting on the incredible highlights of the year and the impactful work achieved through collaboration between the council, educators, families, and the wider community. This year has been marked by a strong commitment to fostering inclusion, sustainability, cultural awareness, and community engagement. I am thrilled to share the following key achievements:

Highlights of 2024

• Inclusion Aware Award: Our centre has been recognized with the prestigious Inclusion Aware Award in all seven areas. This milestone reflects our unwavering commitment to inclusivity and ensuring that every child and family feels valued and supported.

• Guitar Festival Visit: The children had a wonderful opportunity to experience the joy of live music through the Guitar Festival visit. This was a fantastic cultural enrichment activity that inspired creativity and brought our community closer together.

• Welcome Sign Creation: In collaboration with Maureen and Naomi from Spirit in Unity, along with contributions from the children, educators, and the broader community, we unveiled a beautiful new Welcome Sign. This sign is a testament to our shared vision of unity, belonging, and reconciliation.

• RAP (Reconciliation Action Plan) Republished: Our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) was reviewed and republished, reinforcing our ongoing commitment to embedding First Nations perspectives into our curriculum and fostering meaningful relationships with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

Grants and Resource Investments

• **\$4000 Food Sustainability Grant:** We utilized this grant to purchase a fridge for the foyer, which has supported OzHarvest and food donation initiatives for families. Additionally, a small bar fridge for the Under 3 room, a blender, and a sandwich toaster were purchased to enhance our kitchen resources. The remainder of the funds will be used to plant native flora in the garden and entrance, promoting sustainability and a welcoming environment.

• **\$2200 Reconciliation Education SA Grant:** These funds supported the creation of the Welcome Sign and a Closure Day cultural immersion experience facilitated by Spirit in Unity. This day was a significant step in deepening our understanding and respect for First Nations cultures.

Governing Council Contributions

The Governing Council has worked diligently throughout the year to support these initiatives and ensure they align with our shared goals. We have prioritized community engagement, supported funding applications, and collaborated on decision-making processes to benefit the centre.

Looking Ahead

As we move into 2025, we remain committed to building on this year's successes. Our focus will continue to be on fostering a welcoming, inclusive, and sustainable environment for children, families, and educators.



In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.


Preschool Family Opinion Survey



Quality of Teaching and Learning




