Dear Kindy Community,

It is my pleasure to present this year's annual report on behalf of the OEK Governing Council. After three years on the governing council, this year has been one of change, consolidation and rebuilding as we worked together to enhance our community for the children, families, and staff.

#### **Leadership Changes**

In the last twelve months, we said a heartfelt farewell to our previous Director, who dedicated her time and leadership to shaping a positive learning environment for our children. At the same time, we warmly welcomed our new Director Catriona, who has brought new ideas and a strong commitment to our Kindy community. We look forward to working together to continue fostering a supportive and engaging early learning experience.

#### **Governance and Policy Updates**

A key focus for the Governing Council this year was reviewing and updating our policies to ensure they align with the latest department procedures and guidelines. These updates help maintain compliance and improve the overall management of our Kindy, ensuring a safe and nurturing environment for all children.

#### **Facilities and Improvements**

Several important upgrades were made to improve the Kindy's facilities and enhance the learning environment, including:

- The construction of a new storage area, ensuring materials and equipment are wellorganized and accessible.

- The installation of new shade structures, providing additional sun protection and

allowing for more comfortable outdoor play.

- The installation of a filtered tap, giving children and staff access to clean, filtered drinking water throughout the day.

- To kick start the year, we held the now annual Kindy picnic, facilitating strong community connections and bringing together your Governing Council for 2024.

- Excursions provided valuable hands-on learning experiences, allowing children to explore new environments and broaden their understanding of the world. A particular highlight was discovering sea creatures and marine life down at the beach.

- Bonfire Night was a fantastic evening filled with warmth and connection, bringing families together to celebrate and farewell those students graduating in the 'mid-year intake.'

- Diwali celebrations helped us embrace cultural diversity and learn about the significance of the festival of lights.

- Tea towels made with the children's selfportraits was certainly a highlight and a precious memento.

- Graduation was a heartwarming event where we celebrated the achievements of our children as they prepared for the next stage of their educational journey. Unfortunately, due to extreme heat, the end-of-year concert was unable to go ahead as planned. While this was disappointing, the safety and well-being of our children and families always come first, and we appreciated everyone's understanding.

#### **Partnerships and Support**

This year, we also established a partnership with Foodbank, allowing us to support families with additional resources and ensuring that every child has access to nutritious food. We are grateful for this partnership and the positive impact it has had on our community.



In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.



#### Governance, Leadership and Management





## Quality of Teaching and Learning




