## **Context Statement**

Information about Wattle Park Kindergarten is available on the centres website, as well as the Australian Childrens Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) website.

Wattle Park Kindergarten is situated is an established area in the foothills of the Eastern suburbs in the City of Burnside. The learning environment offers multiple opportunities for children to play, explore and collaborate together. Parent and community involvement in the preschool is highly valued with a supportive Governing Council, involved in a wide range of decision making.

The kindergarten's staffing ratio for 2023 was 44 for the first 2 terms and 55 for the second half of the year. We operated two groups, with both having a maximum of 22 children. Each group was staffed by two teachers with a site funded Early Childhood Worker providing support.

This year was the start of the new mid-year intake which meant that we had a new cohort of children joining us from the start of Term 3. As a staff team we have been reflecting on continued ways to welcome this new group of children and families in order for them to have a strong sense of belonging within the kindy community.

During 2023 we continued our many connections with the wider community. This is an area that we value greatly and therefore we sought all opportunities to continue these relationships. We enjoyed many family event and members visiting the kindergarten to share skills and experiences with the children and this provided a wonderful opportunity for the children to learn from others.

Our gardening program with Greenhill Living continued throughout the year and has supported the children to learn about nature and sustainability. During Term 2 we focussed on art and creativity with an Art Show for families to celebrate the children's artistic creations and to raise money for the kindergarten. Our excursions included community walks and a trip to Pepper Street Arts Centre.

In 2023 we welcomed a new teacher, Ellie and we were fortunate to have continuity of staffing across the year.

## **Governing Council Report**

The Governing Council wishes to thank kindergarten leaders and teachers for another successful preschool year, especially with the mid-year intake of students and the careful planning of programs and events that ensured all students were comfortable, engaged and involved.

We successfully held 2 Governing Council meetings per term that were attended by kindergarten leaders and teachers as well as a group of parents who volunteered their time to support the kindergarten operations.

Some achievements for the year include;

- Fundraising \$2287 by holding an art show with a raffle of donated goods and hosting a movie fundraising session at the Regal Theatre
- Successfully holding a working bee to clean and tidy the outdoor space

Thank you to the dedicated parents on the Governing Council for attending the meetings and contributing to the success of the kindergarten this year. Thank you also to the parents and the broader kindergarten community for attending the fundraisers and supporting the students.

We farewell the students who are starting school at the beginning of next year and we look forward to those returning to the kindergarten in 2024.

#### **Attendance Comment**

In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.
