
Attendance Comment

In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

Relationships and Communication


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

Governing Council Chairperson report

On behalf of the Governing Council, I would like to say thank you to the educators for another wonderful year at Pasadena Kindergarten.

In 2023 we welcomed a new director to the kindergarten, Catherine Heyward. The GC supported Catherine's proposal to introduce a music-education program for the students, Musical Muscles with Caleb, which was run on alternate Fridays during Term's 3 and 4.

We provided support for the annual art show and Obstacle-a-thon, while raising funds through the sale of the children's art, baked goods, coffees, and Pasadena Kindergarten fridge magnets. In term two the GC also put on an end-of-term disco celebration for the children, which was a lot of fun!

The 2023 GC approved a long-overdue upgrade to the kindergarten's office facilities, which was successfully completed during the school holidays, at the end of Term 1. Repairs were also undertaken to the kindergarten's shade covering, concluding an action item that was approved by our predecessors, the 2022 GC.

This year saw the kindergarten welcome new students as part of a mid-year intake, which resulted in the kindergarten increasing days in order to facilitate a second group of families. We also said farewell to some students who left kindergarten to commence school mid-year, and with them we lost some GC members. Tiph, Rachel and I strongly encourage any incoming families to consider joining the GC in 2024 – it is a fantastic way to support this lovely resource that we are so lucky to have in our local community.
