In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

2023 saw The lady George Kindergarten go from strength to strength. We had Catherine Meyer joining us as the new director of the kindy, and leading her experienced team of educators, our children were able to grow and learn about themselves and the world around them.

I know that all of our children have benefitted from their year at kindy, and hearing their stories, and seeing how much fun they have, has been a highlight for many of us.

The mid-year intake was something new for the Lady George, but the children joining the Karra group on a Monday and Tuesday settled in so quickly, that it was difficult to tell the difference between them and the 'old-timers' – this is a testament to the welcoming and professional teachers we have at the Lady George.

In terms of excursions, both groups had opportunities to visit Cleland Wildlife Reserve, Highgate School, and others. As a highlight for many, the kindy undertook an excursion in the third term to the Adelaide Zoo. This ultimately led to the fantastic year-end art show with the theme "Download from your Brain and put it behind the Frame", where the children took their favourite animals from the Zoo excursion and transformed into fantastic works of art!

In addition to this, there were a number of Incursions held throughout the year – ranging from the well-known Garden Girl, visits from Unley Library; and even parents coming to share special cultural events or occasions with everyone.

Over the course of the year, the Governing Body arranged for two park socials and two family nights – which were well attended and helped to cement the bonds many of our children have developed over the year.

The new fencing was finally installed, and at the same time the play area had the mulching replaced and topped up – making our play area safe for everyone to use.

Other improvements to the centre, including the acquisition of new bbq for future events will provide further opportunities to host events and foster the sense of community that is so important.

On behalf of the governing council and the broader community, we want to thank Catherine and her dedicated team for a fantastic year of kindy. We know that with such a great team at the helm the 2024 cohort have a similarly fantastic year to look forward to.
