Governing Council Report:

2024 was a busy and productive year at Torrensville Preschool, filled with strong community connections and a shared commitment to high-quality learning.

Under the leadership of Director Claire Evans, the preschool successfully secured disability access funding, and commenced work for important upgrades to lighting, acoustics, the large internal door, and painting. Ongoing improvements also included essential maintenance, such as yard works, paving, and the removal of outdated equipment like the water tank and climbing structure, ensuring a safe and engaging space for children.

The preschool community came together for several fundraising and family events, including a summer picnic featuring a visiting magician, the Illuminate Preschool evening, and an Olympics-themed family day. These events not only strengthened connections among families but also contributed valuable support to the preschool.

Within the centre, the introduction of learning books provided a new and meaningful way to document each child's exploration and development throughout the year. Our educators also invested in their own professional growth, participating in the 2024 Department for Education Numeracy Summit, Orbis' Exploring Play and Self-Regulation program, and team sessions to explore the department's strategy documents.

Thank you to Claire and the preschool team for their passion and commitment, and to my fellow Governing Council members for generously contributing their time and ideas throughout the year. Your support ensures that Torrensville Preschool continues to thrive as a vibrant and inclusive learning environment into 2025 and beyond.



These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.


Preschool Family Opinion Survey



Quality of Teaching and Learning




