Attendance Comment

In South Australia, preschool attendance is not compulsory, but it is strongly encouraged. Preschool gives children the best opportunity to develop skills, which prepare them for school. These benefits include establishing positive routines and habits, friendships and connections as well as developing communication, problem-solving and creative skills. All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

Support of Learning


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

Relationships and Communication


Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

Governing Council Report

This year saw the introduction of Mid-Year intake which has been well supported by Governing Council, and saw some changings in staffing, going from Director/ECW to Director/Teacher for the second half of the year. We approved the site to self-fund the current ECW to ensure continuity of staffing. The ECW has built strong trusting relationships with families and children, has a key role at the site and is valued by all.

The complex needs of the children saw the kindergarten be successful in applying for additional IESP funding to support the most vulnerable children at the site.

Within compliance being a strong focus for the Education Standards Board, we also supported the purchase of new outdoor climbing equipment that meets the children's needs and restricting the access through the gate that connects school and Kindergarten for child safety purposes.

Connections with families at the Playcafe morning was well attended and were Kindergarten Crafternoons. Governing Council supports more opportunities for families and children to meet together across both Kindergarten and Occasional Care.
