As Chairperson of the Governing Council at Ardrossan and Districts Community Kindergarten, I am pleased to reflect on a year filled with significant achievements and progress. One of the highlights was the development of our new kitchen garden, made possible through two successful grants. This project, which includes eight veggie patches and a variety of fruit trees, has not only enhanced our outdoor environment but also provided children with valuable learning experiences around sustainability and healthy living. Additionally, the installation of new grass, a mud kitchen shelter, and natural resource areas has enriched the children's outdoor play and learning opportunities, creating a more engaging and safer environment for everyone.



All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.


Preschool Family Opinion Survey



Quality of Teaching and Learning




