
## **Attendance Comment**

All children are entitled to access a preschool program over 4 terms the year before they start school.

# Quality of Teaching and Learning


#### Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

# Support of Learning


#### Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

# Relationships and Communication


#### Proportion of agree/strongly agree responses (%)

# **Governing Council Report**

2023 has been yet another year of growth for the staff and children of the Neta Kranz Children's Centre. It saw the centre adapt to the new covid 'normal' and reduced restrictions from 2022. We were excited to be able to enjoy a relatively normal graduation with no restrictions placed on attendees (although we wish the weather was a little less windy!). This year the Centre successfully transitioned to a mid-year intake which created only slight interruption in the routine for those who commenced in 2023 and we are confident that with the coming years there will be learnings on how to improve the experience for all children with each intake. The governing council reviewed the centres policies and philosophy. This year the Centres' curriculum focus included on Bookmaking which helps children develop early literacy skills. In 2024 the centre will continue to include bookmaking as a regular activity however with feedback from curriculum support the centre will have an additional focus on emotional and social wellbeing and parents will see activities focused on this.

The Children loved the colour fun run which was held in November. There was great support from the Centres community with many parents relishing in the opportunity to spray coloured chalk over the children.

The governing council's main fundraiser was the end of year Family night and Christmas raffle. There was a good turnout from the centres community and many local businesses donated prizes for the raffle. Overall, the event and raffle raised funds to put towards upgrading the Centre's outdoor play equipment.

Later in 2023 we saw the decommissioning of some items in the garden including mosaiced pavers children had made in 2019 and a little wooden bridge we previously utilised for graduations. Although it is sad to see these items go it opens some space in our outside areas and makes the grounds safe for the children.

Excitingly the governing council supported the commissioning of a mural which will be designed and painted in 2024. The Mural will be designed in collaboration with the children of our centre and local Artist. This artwork will support the development of connections with our local community and local culture.

Thank you to the governing council members for 2023-2024 who donated time in various ways throughout 2023 to support the Neta Kranz Children's Centre and the Community they support.

Thank you to the staff who spend many hours working on how to grow our little people and get them ready for their next stage in life.
