Governing Council Report

The Yorketown Community Children's Centre governing council (GC) had an active membership of 2 staff and 8 parents in 2024.

The GC reviewed and approved numerous policies and procedures across the eight meetings held. This included the Safe arrival of children procedure, Behaviour guidance policy, Water safety policy, Responsibility of children procedure, Toileting procedure, and Immunisation and illness policy and procedure.

In Term 4 the GC also provided input into the centre's philosophy statement which was under review.

The GC worked hard to raise funds for the centre to purchase new play equipment and furniture. Fundraising events included the annual Easter chocolate drive, a Mother's day raffle, and a Preloved Kids Clothing Market which successfully brought the community together to raise over \$1400. Planning is underway to celebrate the 55 year anniversary of YCCC in 2025, thanks to a small subcommittee. A special event will be held in April next year to celebrate with the community, including past students and staff.

An audit that was conducted in the yard earlier in the year highlighted the risks and issues with the current playground equipment, which has been there for quite some time. Planning has begun to replace the playground in the centres yard. The GC agreed to use the centre savings account to fund the upgrade and initial quotes have been obtained and reviewed. To keep costs down we will be seeking help from families at working bees early in the new year. We are hopeful to see a new playground in the yard by mid-2025 for all children to enjoy.

Thank you to all the GC members for volunteering their time and effort this year.




Preschool Family Opinion Survey



Quality of Teaching and Learning




